This issue of "The Stitcher" gives a sneak peek at the soon to be released ELEVENTH block in the "VASES OF FLOWERS" Quilt – "Anemones". This pattern is due to be completed within the next few weeks but orders will be taken and dispatched ASAP.

In all 25 x 16 blocks will be released. In every issue of "The Stitcher", we hope to have at least one new block pattern to be released. We need to thank four wonderful ladies for their hard work and contributions in getting these designs released; Jill McGregor, Margaret Sampson, Pat Loose and Kris Petty. Margaret originally designed the quilt in colour but it also looks great stitched in cream thread. The patterns will be available indefinitely.

The pattern packs now available are—Anemones, Hibiscus, Freesias, Cooktown Orchids, Roses, Daisies, Tulips, Dahlias, Gerberas, Poppies, Pansies.
